Contents & Purpose	<p>This activity focuses on the Narcissus flower and presents the myth of Narcissus. The story of Narcissus (referred to as an ancient Greek legend) is adapted as a rhymed poem and there are questions following the story. There is also botanical information on the flower.</p> <p>The activity takes around 15 min. No prior knowledge is needed.</p> <p>The online activity accompanies the lessons in class.</p>
Further comments	<p>This activity introduces the mythological story of Narcissus and complement it with botanical information regarding the flower. Thus it combines mythology and botanical research and demonstrates the influence of mythology on other disciplines.</p>
