	Intended for middle and high school students learning mythology. First part of the book presents well-known myths, such as the origin of the world, Jason and the Argonauts, or Hercules' Twelve Labours. The language of the first part is simple to ensure that students understand every detail. Myths are not modified, they corresponds to the popular, original classical versions. The second part is designed to provide students with basic information to study myths. The author explains the names of gods and heroes, places and religious festivals. The main purpose is to teach students classical mythology and help them write about it. The book explains many various related terms, helps to learn the basics allowing readers to start their adventure with ancient literature.
Analysis	The series, "Well-Prepared Readers", contains texts of school readers and complementary material facilitating the students' understanding and analysis of the main content and adding some secondary

and complementary material facilitating the students' understanding and analysis of the main content and adding some secondary information. Mythology by Rutkowski meets the purpose of the series as it has an informative character. The myths presented by Rutkowski are not the types of stories to be told to explain the world nor to entertain the reader but to learn. The narration is straightforward, divided into short chapters and sub-chapters, each of them focused on an individual myth.

The publisher recycled texts from the two mythologies by Rutkowski: <u>Mity greckie dla dzieci. Bogowie</u> and <u>Mity greckie dla dzieci. Herosi</u>, presented there as books for children. The edition for children used graphic design aimed at a young age group, with colorful and blackand-white illustrations, ancient motifs as borders on the upper margin (meander, palmette, anthemion, wave), full-page maps drawn in colour displaying details mentioned in the book, larger fonts and page formats are used there. In this edition, the text is divided into smaller sections, restructured differently and aimed at older readers, although, in some

cases, it appears too basic for high school students.

	The educational character of this publication becomes obvious through illustrations: instead of the previous colourful layout, there are drawings of sculptures of specific gods and/or mythical scenes. The selected figures are all very well-known (like for example, the statues of Zeus of Otricoli, Apollo Belvedere, <i>Menelaus bearing the corpse of Patroclus</i> from Loggia dei Lanzi from the Roman times, or the Baroque Italian sculpture, <i>The Rape of Proserpina</i> by Bernini), and are described along with their history and location so that the students receive comprehensive information. The book also uses historical black-and-white photographs of some important Greek sites (Delphi, Sounion, Acropolis of Athens) from the album by Tadeusz Zieliński <i>Grecja. Budownictwo, plastyka, krajobraz</i> [Greece. Architecture, Fine Arts, Landscape] published in 1923. At the end, additional material is provided, including information about Greek religion, myths, Hesiod and Homer, the main gods, Dionysus, heroes and archetypes, topoi, as well as the types and functions of myths. There are no indexes.
