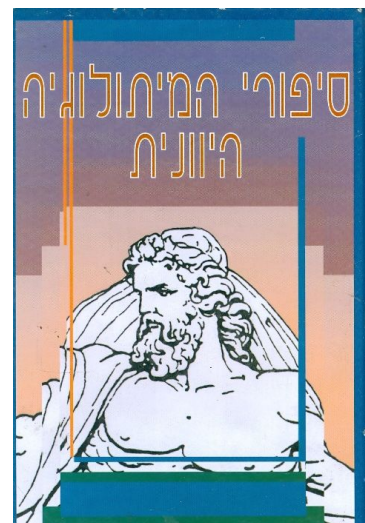

### Analysis

The book offers a short collection of stories from Greek mythology (for example, the birth of Venus) accompanied by illustrations. The stories are adapted for young teens.

According to Maurice (2016), 323–324: "Written on commission, Dalman used a range of sources in both Hebrew and English in composing the books. They ... detailed compendia of classical mythology in a form accessible to young readers...These books were published as part of the publisher's children's book collection, which included story anthologies, such as Grimm's fairy tales, animal fables,



and translated classic juvenile literature."\*
